What is PRIMER?

- PRIMER is a Patient and Public Involvement (PPI) group based at the Centre for Primary Care at The University of Manchester
- We are a group composed of patients, service users, carers and members of the public with a common interest in, and enthusiasm for, primary care research
- We started our work in 2009 and have two types of membership- attending and corresponding Attending members come along to meetings
 - Corresponding members are part of a virtual group offering their input through email, post and telephone correspondence
- Chair and Vice Chair are elected by and from PRIMER members
- We are supported and funded by the Centre for Primary Care with whom we work in close partnership

What happens at a PRIMER meeting?

- We meet every 6-8 weeks
- We have two research presentation slots providing researchers with the opportunity to talk to us about their ideas for research
- Researchers are encouraged to come along before their grant application is submitted ensuring our views
 are heard when there is still opportunity to shape the direction of the research
- Prior to the meeting, researchers are asked to provide us with a plain English summary of their idea for a project: the aims of the project, why it is important, what it will entail (especially for participants), and a summary of the PPI strategy.
- Researchers present their ideas to us and we provide them with our feedback followed by open discussion
- We suggest ways to involve people and if appropriate we may get involved ourselves
- We receive an honorarium and travel expenses. To avoid lengthy waits for reimbursement, we are paid
 on the day
