The Schools research capacity programme aims to train future leaders in primary care research. Our unique collaboration between academic centres in England provides a setting where trainees can benefit from the leadership of researchers across all member departments. We aim to build research capacity in primary care by providing multidisciplinary training and development opportunities, nurturing trainees from a range of professional backgrounds.

The School's mentoring scheme was developed in 2013 with the Society for Academic Primary Care (SAPC) scheme and the Primary Healthcare Scientists (PHoCUS) group. We provide support to early/mid-stage primary healthcare scientists from any background discipline other than medicine.
