The CONSULT ME study is a mixed-methods study that aims to understand the perspective of patients and carers about student-led remote GP consultations. The study objectives include: (1) a short survey with adults (18 years and over) with experience of being invited to speak to a medical student over the telephone, and (2) semi-structured follow-up interviews to understand patient and carer experiences in more depth. This is a multi-site study led by collaborators at four Medical Schools (UCL, QMUL, University of Leeds and Keele University). The study has received funding from the SPCR and will begin 1st July 2024.

We are seeking an intern to assist with setting up the study and preparing the publication of a study protocol. This will include the preparation of an online survey, assisting with recruitment of GP practices employed by each Medical School, advertising the study, preparing study databases ready for data collection, and drafting a study protocol for publication.
