Definitions

The SPCR has adopted the INVOLVE definition of PPI:

‘...as research being carried out ‘with’ or ‘by’ members of the public rather than ‘to’, ‘about’ or ‘for’ them. This includes, for example, working with research funders to prioritise research, offering advice as members of a project steering group, commenting on and developing research materials and undertaking interviews with research participants,

..... The term ‘public’ includes patients, potential patients, carers and people who use health and social care services. Whilst all of us are actual, former or indeed potential users of health and social care services, there is an important distinction to be made between the perspectives of the public and the perspectives of people who have a professional role in health and social care services’.

Aims

This SPCR PPI strategy recognises the NIHR policy for patient involvement, and has been developed as part of a wider commitment across the NIHR. The strategy aims to facilitate the translation of NIHR policy and INVOLVE guidance into practice within SPCR, as appropriate in local contexts. Each department in the School will have its own, locally developed mechanisms for PPI. The strategy is underpinned by key principles of good practice that should, however, apply regardless.

Objectives

1. Improve PPI reporting, and review the process of monitoring PPI in the SPCR
2. Promote involvement through shared learning and dissemination of key resources
3. Monitor Diversity in PPI panels across SPCR
4. Review PPI capacity within the organisation of the SPCR
5. Collaborate with other NIHR infrastructures to co-ordinate PPI activity (where appropriate)
