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Introduction

Patient and public involvement is about researchers working as equal partners with patients, carers, and members of the public to do research. Many different terms are used to describe people who are involved in research. But the term ‘public collaborator’ will be used throughout this booklet because it is the preferred term by the APEX Public Collaborator Group who developed this booklet.

The purpose of this **Public Collaborator Training Booklet** is to provide public collaborators with a central place to access and engage with a range of support and learning opportunities to build your skills and confidence for patient and public involvement in research. The booklet will be updated annually to ensure it includes new training as it becomes available.

This package is split into three core topic themes – **Research methods**, **Interpersonal skills**, and **Public Collaborator Roles**. Under each of the core topic themes there are *Explore*, *Grow*, and *Support* training options:



Explore training includes introductory materials that may be useful to public collaborators who are new to patient and public involvement and would like a little bit more information.



Grow training includes materials that will help public collaborators with experience of patient and public involvement grow new skills that will be useful in future involvement and engagement work.



Support training includes opportunities for public collaborators with experience of patient and public involvement to come together and reflect upon their experiences, learn from one another and take new strategies forward.

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Research Methods and Approaches

As a public collaborator you may work on a range of different research projects, and each may use lots of different methods to investigate the topic. Training available in this core topic will help you to explore the different research methods that are used in health and social care research, grow a new range of research skills to engage in patient and public involvement within a range of projects, support one another to engage in meaningful patient and public involvement in a range of projects and can practice new skills that you have developed.
